WELCOME

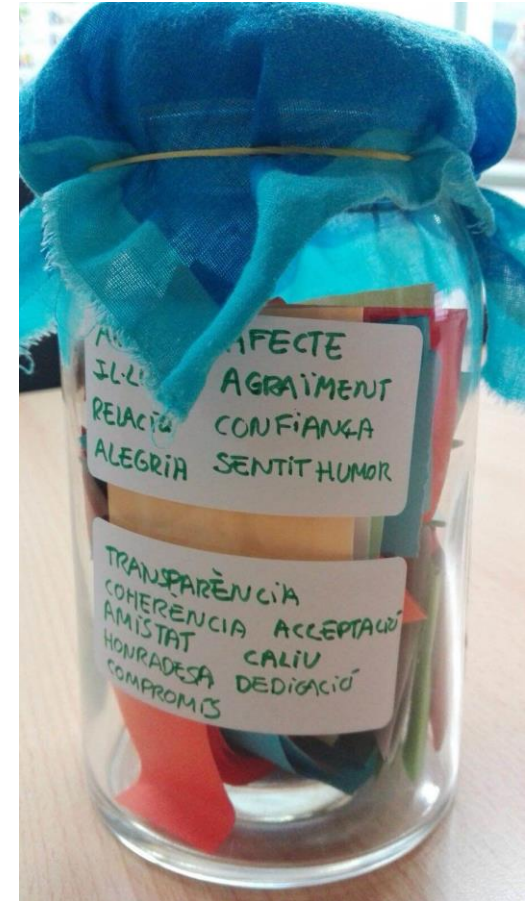
In this tough year, marked by numerous humanitarian crisis, I present you this memory, which represents the work, commitment and solidarity for and with people who have been victims of human trafficking.

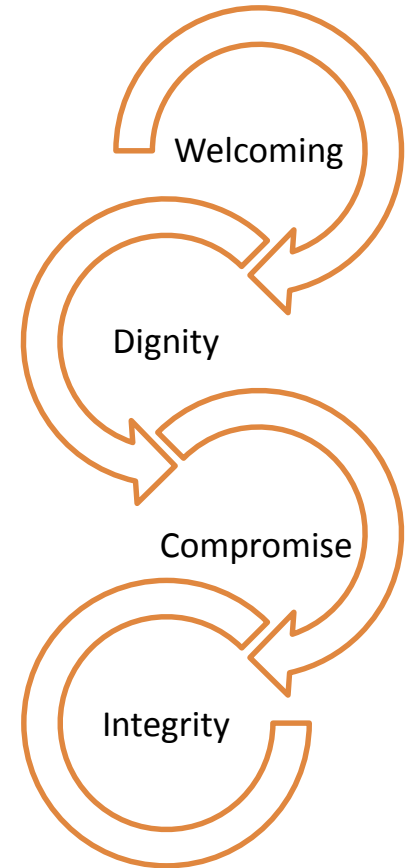
Achieve the financial sustainability of the programa with diversified funds.
Keep our presence and voice in key organizations and leadership in the field of human trafficking in Catalonia.

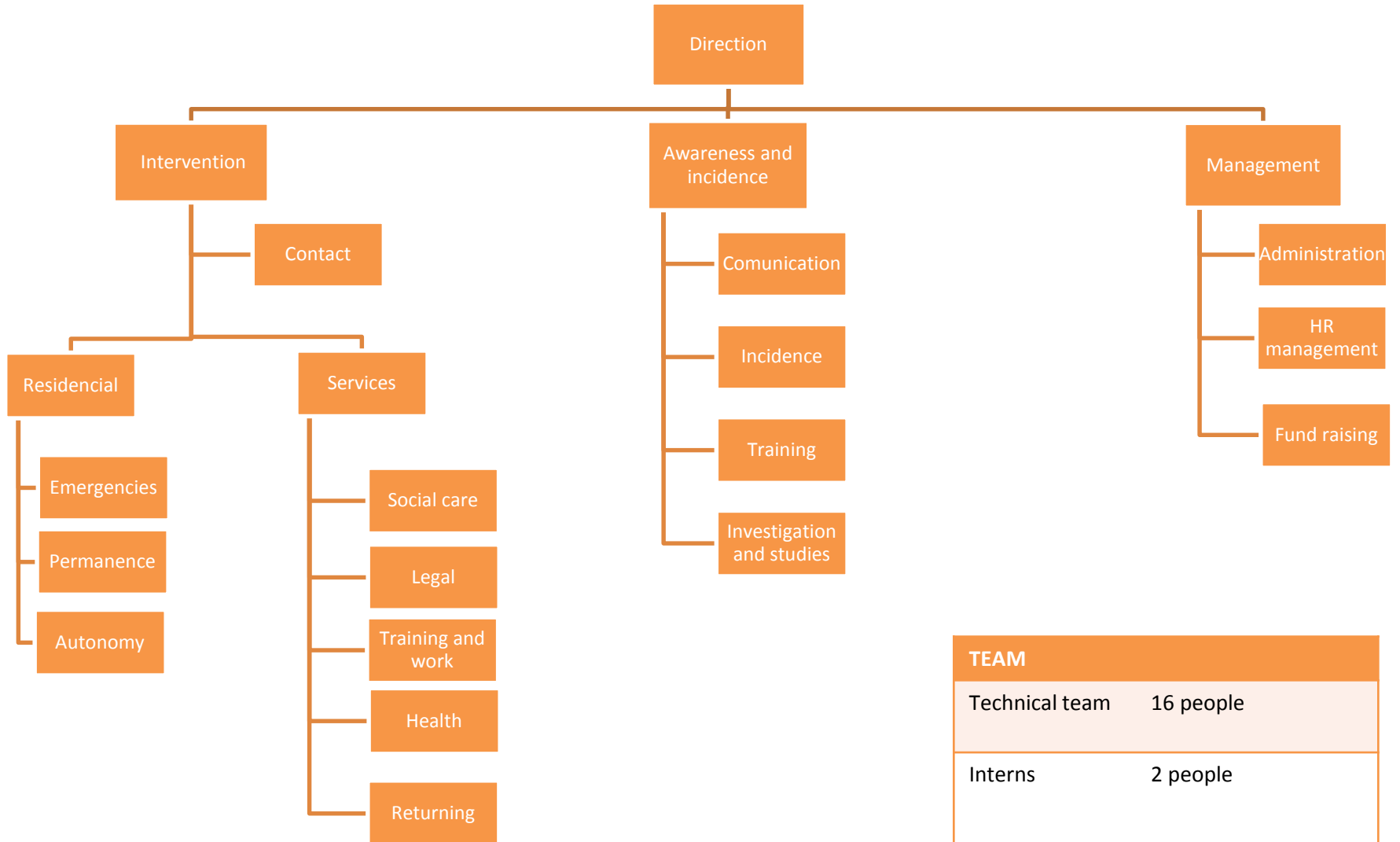
Keep generating knowledge in a systematic way.

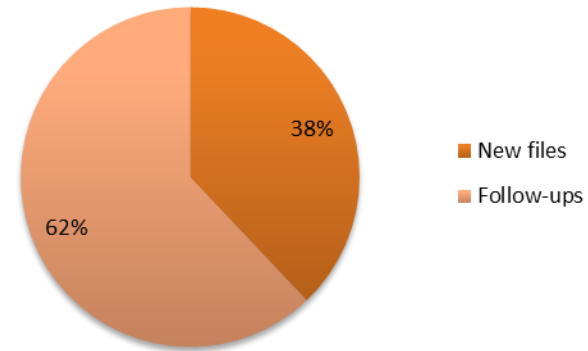

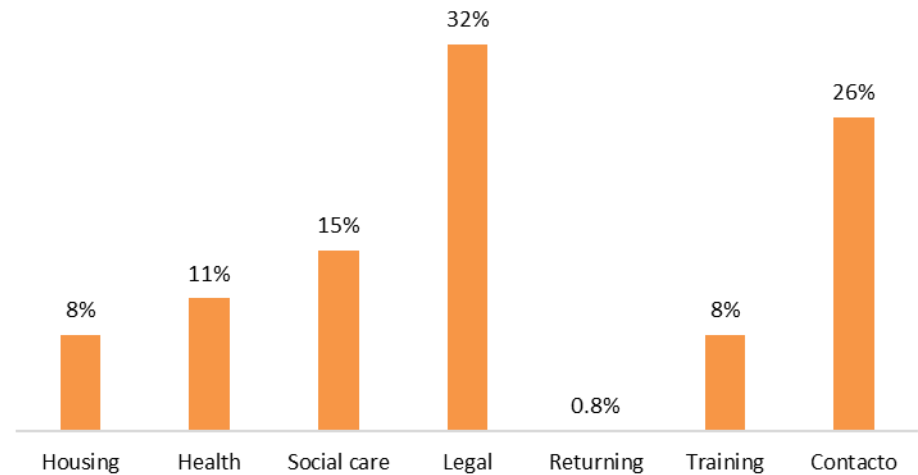

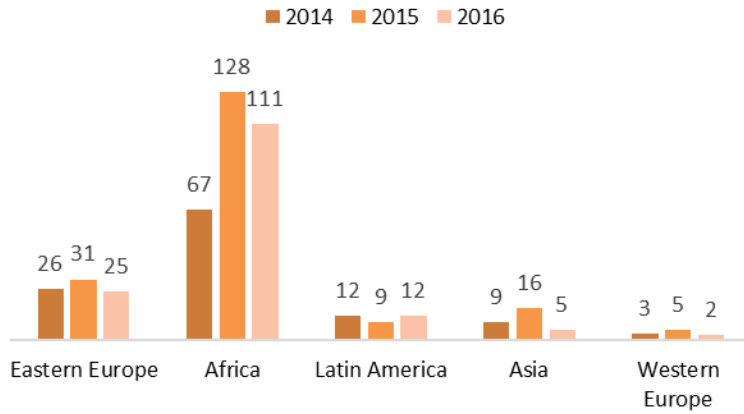

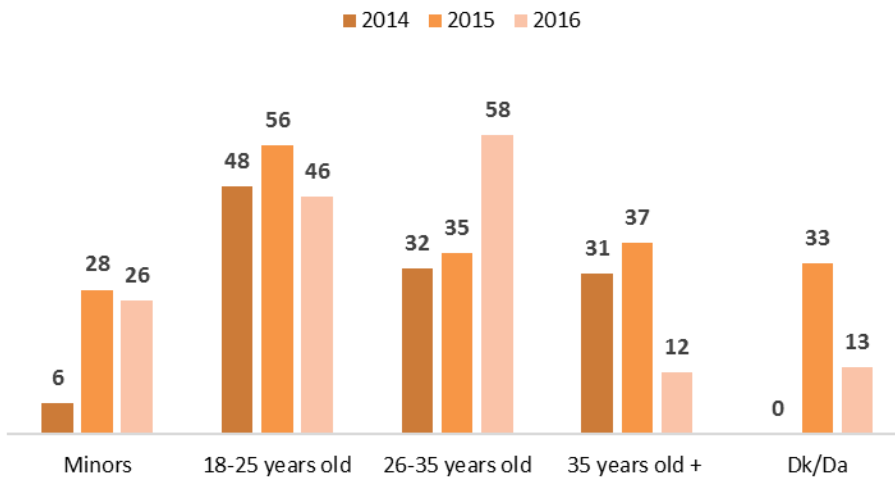
EVOLUTION OF THE ORIGIN



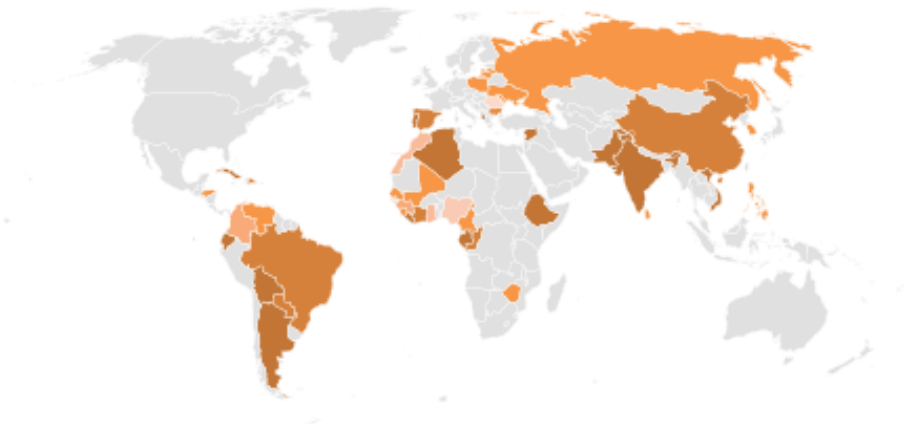

ORIGIN 2016



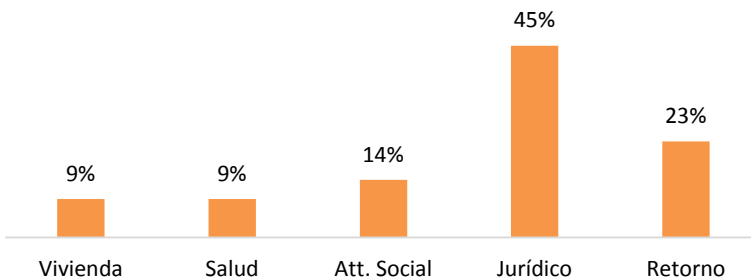

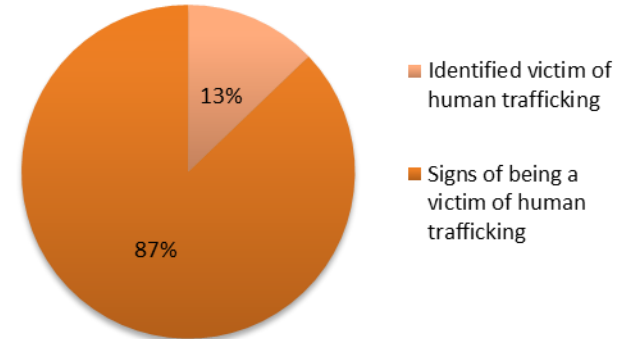

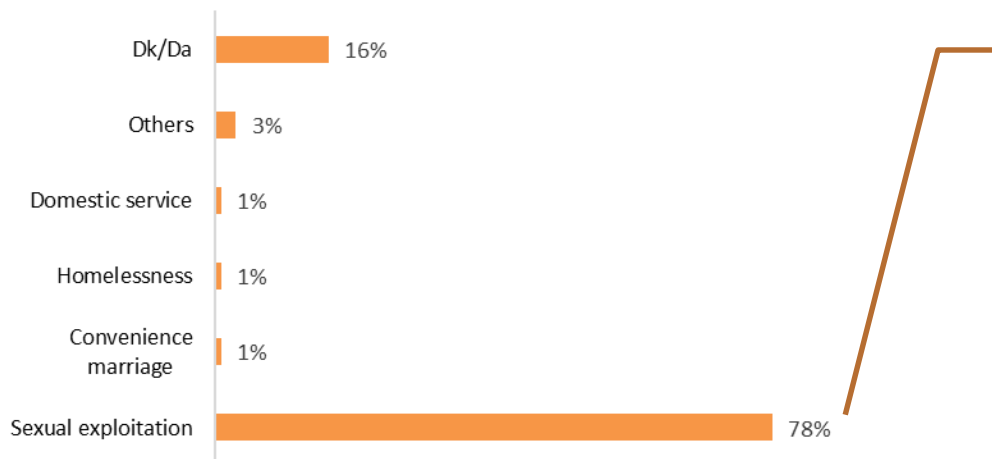

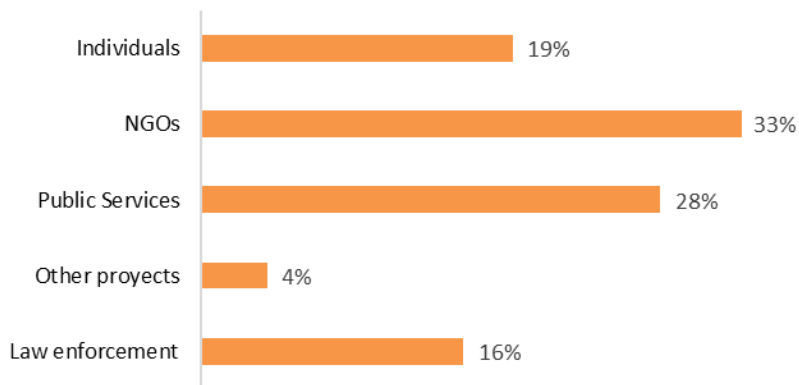


TYPE OF EXPLOITATION

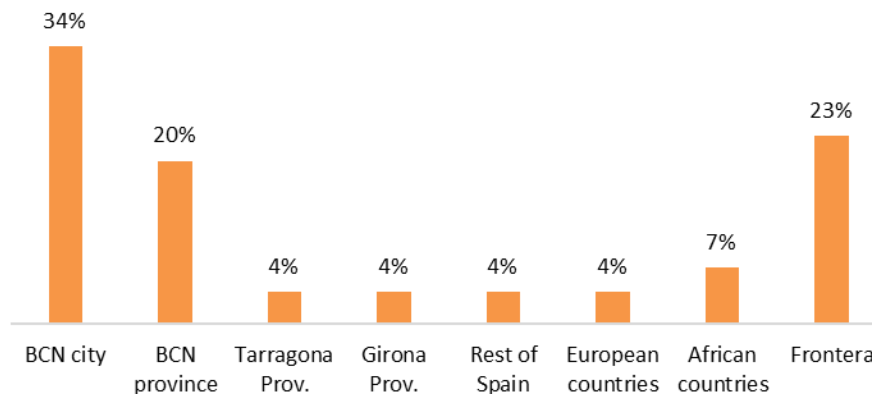


- 42 victims referred to our own resources and to external resources

- No victims or people who shows signs of being a victim in the province of Lleida.
- Border demands have risen an 18% in comparison with 2015 and they come from the airport Barcelona-El Prat.

ACCESS ROUTE



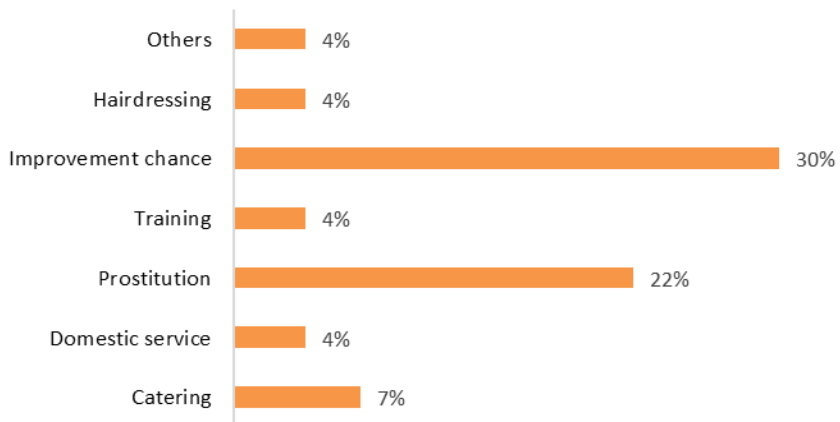
TERRITORY OF ORIGIN OF THE DEMANDS



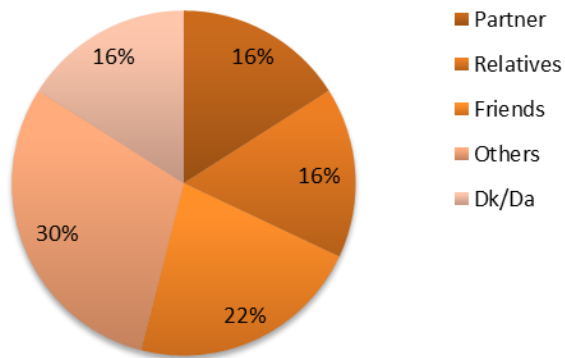

RECRUITMENT



2016

From a sample of 27 women:

- 78% come from a family context of social vulnerability
- 74% keep a good relationship with their family
- 48% are in charge of children
- 37% are not in charge of anybody
- 44% were lied to about the reason of the trip
- 41% performed a ritual or similar as a contract
- 59% went into debts with the traffickers
- 33% travelled by plane
- 60% travelled by land
- 34% travelled directly to Spain
- 67% travelled through transit countries
- 33% travelled together with other women
- 59% were freed by their own means
- 52% are in danger, and so are their families

SOCIAL CARE

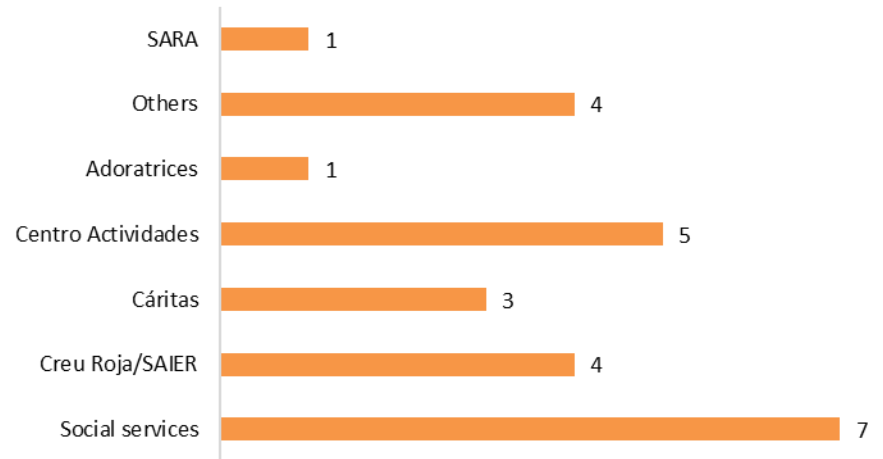
OBJECTIVE

Follow the social integration process of victims of human trafficking, promotion of their own abilities and ease of Access to resources that help improving their quality of life.

ACTIONS AND RESULTS

Basic needs	41 demands
Financial support	40 grants given as a response for the 41 demands
Coordination	20 coordinated work plans with other entities and resources
Referrals	25 referrals to external services
Activities	42 activities organized 22 women participating
Disability certificate	5 women were accompanied during the examination

REFERRALS



We have settled 98% of the demands for basic needs.

HOUSING

OBJECTIVE

Identify and take care of, from the different housing devices of ours (emergencies, stay and autonomy) and of external institutions, the basic needs of the women who have been victims of human trafficking for exploitation in Catalonia and helping them in the process of empowerment and decision taking, while protecting them and keeping them safe.

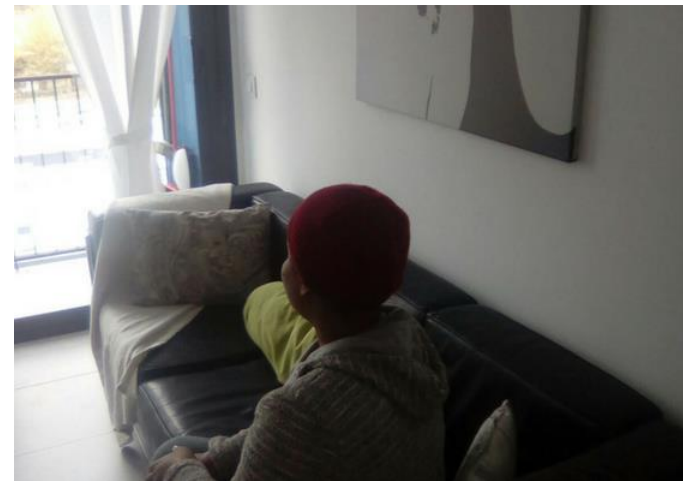

We have answered a 77% of the 48 housing-related demands.

RETURNING

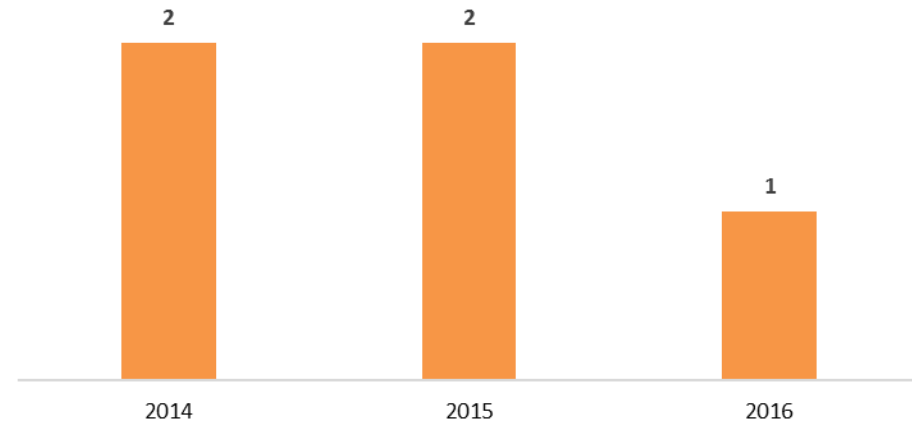
OBJECTIVE

Help women who have victims or are potential victims of human trafficking, whether they have been identified or not, returning voluntarily to their country of origin in conditions of security and dignity.

VOLUNTARY RETURN



Since 2014, we have kept a collaboration agreement with the International Organization for Migration (IOM). They guarantee the safety of the women while they return to their country of origin.

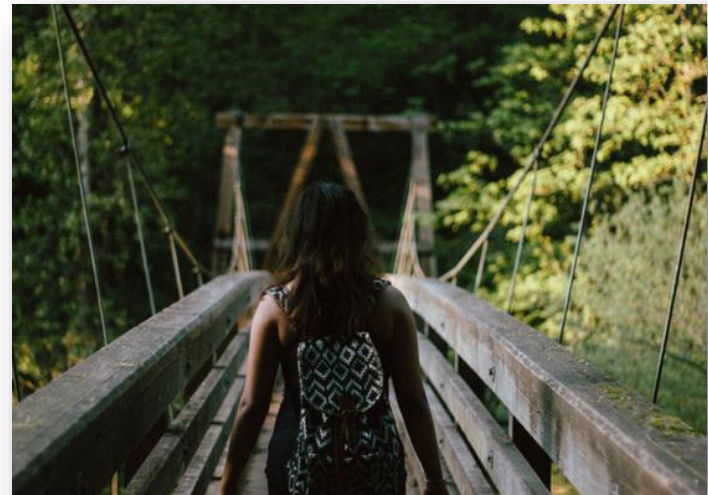
HEALTH

OBJECTIVE

Allow the Access to healthcare, which is the right of the victims, to complement the recovery both in a physical and a psychological sense.

ACTIONS AND RESULTS

TRAINING AND WORK

OBJECTIVE

Escort the victims during the process of training and labour integration.

ACTIONS AND RESULTS

Assisted women	25 women assisted 13 women found a post 12 women on tracking
Project RAI	11 women
Training	68% women attend courses in Spanish 32% women attend courses in català 11% women attend IT courses 5% women attend technical courses 21% women attend job training courses 3 women doing internships from their job training
Labour integration	10 women find a job (6 participate in RAI) 50% of women who have found a job have kept it for more than 3 months, with a work agreement in order with the minimum interprofesional salary.

2016

13 women were included in the process:

- 38% without training, 31 % with basic training, 31% with secondary education
- 62% with previous work experience, specially in the country of origin
- 39% speak Spanish, 61% does not speak Spanish or Català.

2016

- 60% of the 10 women who have found a job, also have a work agreement
- 60% of the 10 women who have found a job have kept it for at least 8 months
- 60% of the 10 women who have found a job have earned a salary equal to or superior to the the minimum interprofesional salary
- Most frequent jobs: cleaner, maid, shop assistance, customer
- 75% of the new jobs were obtained thanks to the intermediation with resources, entities and companies

OBJECTIVE

Create a legal service that allows victims of human trafficking to have access to legal and administrative procedures.

ACTIONS AND RESULTS

Assisted women	96 women assisted

Recovered documentation	30% of the women recover their documents
Criminal procedure	48 women participate in criminal procedures
Reports	9 women report their situation and 44% report as a protected witness
Escorts to judicial statements or preconstituted evidence	7 escorts: 4 judicial statements 3 preconstituted evidences
Asylum	32 women candidate for international protection (23 in the territory, 9 in the border) 19 asylum seekers (10 in the territory, 9 in the border)



2016

Out of the 38 women who came for the first time:

- 8% victims from the EU
- 82% victims who are in Spain illegally
- 10% victims who are in Spain legally
- 20 women, 53%, benefited from section 59 bis LOEX

Out of the 58 women we are following:

- 2 women, 3%, benefited from section 59 bis LOEX

10 temporary stay an work permits:

- 5 thanks to a collaboration with the police
- 5 because of the personal situation of the women

2 permanent residence and work permits for 5 years:

- 1 thanks to a collaboration with the police
- 1 because of the personal situation of the women

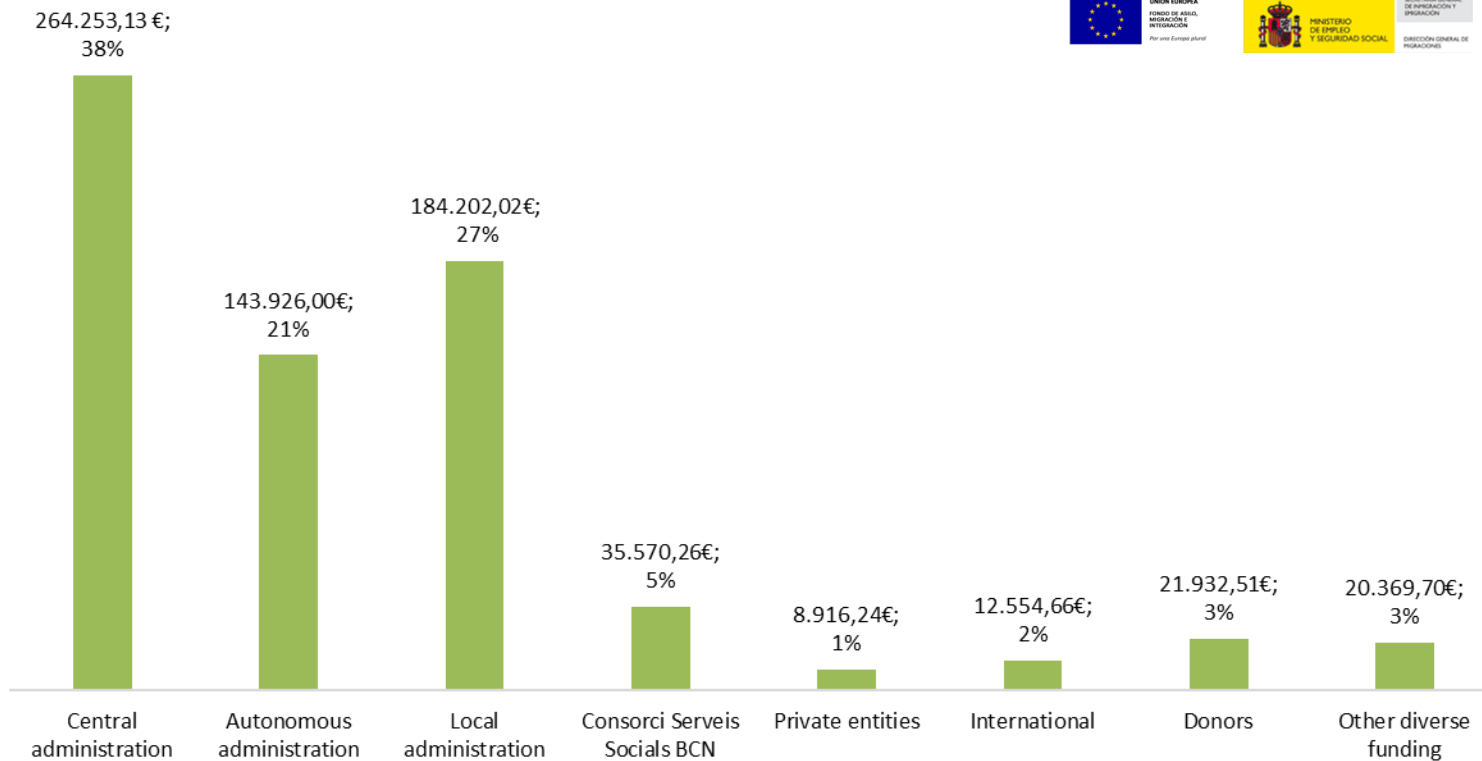

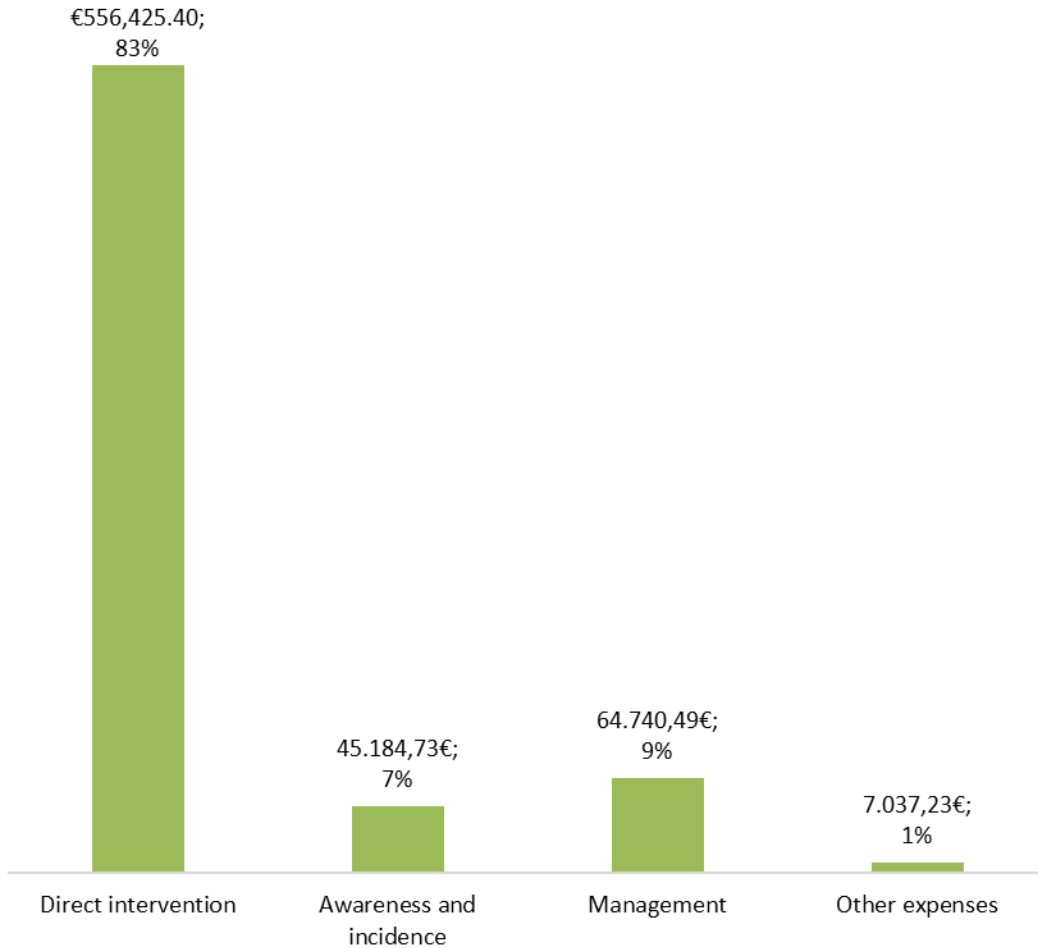

INCOME TOTAL INCOME €691,724.35



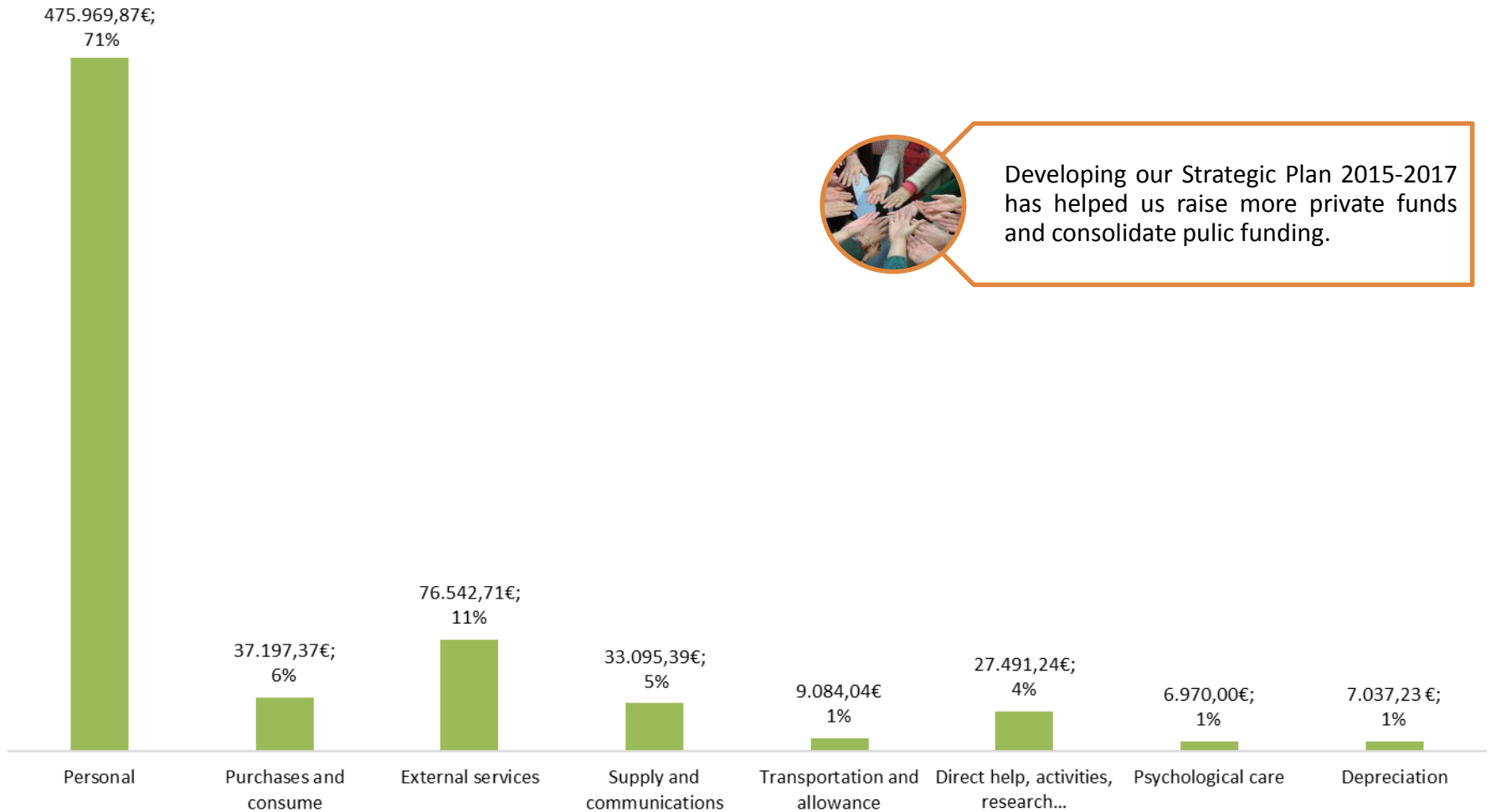
EXPENSES BY AREA TOTAL €673,387.85
